

Peanut Drops Earrings


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
String 1 A, 1 B, 1 A and 1 B, then go through again to make a circle coming out of A bead



Add 6 A beads to form a loop for attaching the earwire. Go thorugh all 7 A beads again, then carry thread through beads to exit bottom A bead.



Add 1 A, 1 B, 3 As, 1 B and 1 A. Go through the A bead you exited below the round before. Thread through the beads just added until you exit the center A on the bottom.



Add 2 As, 2 Bs, 1 A, one drop bead, 1 A, 2 Bs, and 2 As. Go through center bead from round above. Reinforce any part of the earrings that seems as if it needs stiffening or tightening by going through the areas again. Tie a know and carry threads through the earring. Cut thread. Attach earwire.

Now make another one!
